WHAT DO PHLEBOTOMY TECHNICIANS DO?

Phlebotomy Technicians work mainly in hospitals, medical and diagnostic laboratories, blood donor centers, and doctors' offices. primary job is to draw blood from a patient or donor for tests, transfusions, blood donations, or research. Their duties frequently include the following:

- Draw blood from patients and blood donors
- Ensure proper labeling of the blood
- Label the drawn blood for testing or processing
- Enter patient information into a database
- Assemble and maintain medical instruments

JOB OUTLOOK



The Bureau of Labor and Statistics projects employment of Phlebotomists will **increase 17% between 2019 and 2029**. This is much faster than average. (bls.gov)

SALARY



The median salary of Phlebotomists was \$36,320 per year in 2020. In Massachusetts metropolitan areas, **the hourly average wage was \$20.24 and the annual average wage was \$42,100**. (bls.gov)
