

Articulation Agreement
Roxbury Community College and Eastern Nazarene College



Statement of Purpose

Eastern Nazarene College (ENC) embraces its multicultural and urban environment by preparing students to lead and serve in a diverse world by integrating "the best in education and the best in Christian faith". ENC provides a holistic educational experience that integrates spiritual, academic and social development to prepare students to effectively serve in a changing world. This agreement, ("Agreement") is formed to provide smooth transition from Roxbury Community College into Eastern Nazarene College for students seeking a bachelor of arts in social work. The mission of the Social Work Department at Eastern Nazarene College is to prepare graduates for entry level generalist social work practice, and/or to attend graduate school to obtain a Master's Degree in Social Work, with a liberal arts education as a foundation. With Jesus Christ as our example of the transformative servant leader, students will be guided by Christian principles and the congruent social work values and ethics to become true change agents. The overriding emphasis of social work is to promote the social functioning of individuals, families, groups, organizations, and communities, and to promote social and economic justice.

Further, this agreement seeks to provide smooth transition between the two academic programs by

- 1 identifying all required and equivalent courses for the relevant programs at each institution, and
- 2 facilitating credit transfer and guarantee of admission for students who meet the agreed upon criteria.

Participants

This Agreement has been entered into by Roxbury Community College, Roxbury, MA and Eastern Nazarene College, Quincy, MA.

Programs/Courses Included in this Agreement

- A. The Roxbury Community College Social Science Associate program will be accepted toward the Bachelor of Arts in Social Work at Eastern Nazarene College.
- B. This acceptance will be extended to students who received credit through Roxbury Community College.
- C. All coursework taken towards the Social Science Associate degree will be accepted and applied towards required coursework and electives as stipulated in the Social Work major in the Bachelor of Arts program. **See appendix A.**

Terms and Conditions of Transfer:

- A. Students who graduate with the Social Science Associate in Arts degree with a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher and successfully interview with the Social Work department will be guaranteed admission into the Social Work program at Eastern Nazarene College.

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B. Students who graduate with the Social Science Associate in Arts degree with a cumulative GPA of less than 3.0 may be admitted into Eastern Nazarene College and will be allowed one semester in the Social Work department, after which the student will apply for admittance into the Social Work program. To view ENC Social Work Requirements **See Appendix B.**

C. In addition, 62 credits completed toward the Roxbury Social Science Associate in Arts degree will be accepted by Eastern Nazarene College and be applied to the Social Work major, with 64 credits remaining to be completed in the Bachelor of Arts degree, provided the recommended course sequence is followed. All coursework from the sending program must be completed with grades of C- or better in order to transfer.

D. All students accepted into the Social Work program at ENC are eligible to apply for the Social Work Transfer Scholarship. **See Appendix C**

Communications and Advising

Communication and advising is central to effective transfer/articulation. Recognizing this:

A. The colleges agree to include information about this articulation agreement in relevant publications for the purposes of promotion and advising.

B. The colleges agree to jointly develop appropriate transfer guides and make these available to students and advisors as appropriate.

C. The colleges agree to notify each other promptly, in writing, of substantive changes in curricula that might affect the Agreement.

Implementation and Length of Agreement

A. Eastern Nazarene College and Roxbury Community College agree that this Agreement becomes effective on 3/19/21 (date) and is applicable to eligible students matriculating after the effective date of this Agreement

B. This Agreement will remain in effect unless terminated or amended by either party with prior written notice.

C. This Agreement does not preclude either college from entering into similar agreements with other institutions of higher education.

Appendix C

Social Work Transfer Scholarship Description

Four (4) scholarships per year, each in the amount of \$2,500 for a total of \$10,000.

Criteria

- Eligible students will be transferring to ENC's social work program from a local community college.
- Eligible students must have a GPA of 3.0 or above in the community college program from which they are transferring.
- Eligible students will submit a one-page essay that briefly describes their commitment to the social work profession.

Procedure for Awarding Scholarships

- The social work program faculty, in conjunction with Enrollment personnel who will assist in identifying eligible prospective students, will select recipients.

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Social Work (BA) Requirements

Degree Requirements

- Fulfill all General Degree Requirements
- Admission into the Social Work Program, minimum GPA 2.7 in all courses required for the baccalaureate degree in Social Work; minimum cumulative GPA 2.3; no grade lower than C- in all courses required for the baccalaureate degree in Social Work.
- Elective Credits (Social Work or other), 30 credits
